



Understanding Grade Level Scores on DORA

Acronyms used by Let's Go Learn on the *DORA* report page

DORA

HF - High-Frequency Word Sub-Test- Score Range: 0.50 to 3.83 (Mid-K to High 3rd)

WR - Word Recognition Sub-Test- Score Range: 0.50 to 12.83 (Mid-K to High 12th)

PH - Phonics Sub-Test- Score Range: 0.17 to 4.83 (Low-K to High 4th)

PA - Phonemic Awareness Sub-Test- Score as a percentage (out of 100%)

SP - Spelling Sub-Test- Score Range: 0.5 to 12.83 (Mid-K to High 12th)

VO - Vocabulary Sub-Test- Score Range: 0.50 to 12.83 (Mid-K to High 12th)

CO Comprehension Sub-Test- Score Range: 0.5 to 12.83 (Mid-K to High 12th)

All grade-level scores reflect a grade level (to the left of the decimal) and at what point in the school year the student is performing (to the right of the decimal):

0.17- Early in that grade

0.5- Middle of that grade

0.83- End of that grade

For example, if a student scores a 4.5 in Phonics, this means that the student is working at a mid-fourth grade level in that skill. A 0.5 in Comprehension (CO), as seen above, is a mid-Kindergarten score. Note that High-Frequency Words (HF) has a maximum score of 3.83 and appears in green and that Phonics (PH) has a maximum score of 4.83, which also appears in green. Any scores that appear in Red represent a non-mastery of the lowest set of questions within a sub-test.
