## **Before Reading "Book Cover Talk"**

Before your child begins reading a text by him/herself, have a brief discussion using some of the following questions. Keep in mind whether the text you are using is fiction or non-fiction. Try not to judge whether your child's responses are "right" or "wrong." Just be curious about your child's thinking. Read the title to your child and let him/her examine the book cover. Then ask some of the following questions:

# What do you think this book is going to be about?

# What makes you think that?

# What clues do you see on the cover that tell us what we are going to read about?

# (For a fiction text) What do you guess the problem might be in this story?

# (For a non-fiction text) What do you already know about \_\_\_\_\_\_\_? (For example, the book might be about vehicles or the rainforest. What does your child already know about the particular subject?)

# Can you tell me more about that?

Some examples of responses from you that do not seem evaluative (or as if your child is "right" or "wrong"):

- # That's very interesting. I wonder if that will happen in this book!
- # That might happen!
- # I can see why you think that way.
